

Working instruction on the use of the washable mask

1 Instruction

1.1 Standards

The mask must comply with the following:

- Minimum of 2 layers of protection
- Be resistant to a minimum of 50 washes
- Identifiable
- Supported by an elastic band or easily detachable mechanism
- Machine washable
- Machine dryable

Note: In order to meet the minimum requirements, the masks used in the workplace must be those provided by VIA RAIL Canada.

1.2 Wearing a mask

1.2.1 Distribution - Dispensing

Mechanical

A kit of washable masks and comfort clip will be provided based on a proper rotation (washing after each use and wearing an average of a usage per day. The kit should last a minimum of 6 months.

Note: The masks are distributed in an airtight bag and can therefore be distributed to the workers. In addition, they are considered to be clean, so they can be worn immediately after distribution.

1.2.2 Storage of masks

When masks are not in use, they must be in an airtight container to avoid contamination and kept in a sealable container (e.g. Ziplock type of bag). Ensure not to mix the clean masks with the used one's.

1.2.3 Use/Handling

How to wear a mask:

1. Before putting on your clean and dry mask, wash your hands with soap and warm water for at least 30 seconds or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer; remove your glasses (if applicable);
2. Make sure that your hair is tied back and does not touch the front of the mask and that it is away from your face;
3. Attach the elastic loops around your ears (don't forget to remove the earrings, ear piercings or ear jewellery);
4. Cover your mouth and nose with the mask, make sure there is no space between your face and the mask;
5. Make sure the mask fits snugly and comfortably against your face;



6. Place your glasses;
7. Avoid touching the front of the mask while wearing it;
8. Wash your hands with soap and warm water for at least 30 seconds or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer if you accidentally touch your mask.

1.2.4 Comfort clip

The purpose of the comfort clip it's to reduce the tension on the ears when you need to wear the mask for a long period of time. After putting you're mask on, you can add the comfort clip.



1.3 Removing and disposing of the mask

How to remove/dispose of your mask:

1. Do not touch the front of your mask to remove it;
2. Wash your hands with soap and water or an alcohol-based hand sanitizer;
3. Remove the elastic loops of the mask from your ears;
4. Hold only the straps and place the mask in an airtight bag (e.g., Ziplock bag).



5. Wash your hands with soap and warm water for at least 30 seconds or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer after removing your mask;

More information about masks:

1. When a mask becomes wet or damp, replace it with a new mask;
2. When worn continuously, a mask may be worn for a maximum period of 4 hours and need to be changed;
3. Clean and disinfect all objects that come into contact with the mask, e.g. mobile phone, radio, microphones, etc., as soon as possible;
4. Practice social distancing if possible while wearing a mask;
5. Avoid touching your nose, eyes, mouth, or face when wearing a mask.

**Note: There is no clear evidence that wearing a mask will protect you from the virus, but wearing a mask can help protect others around you.*

1.4 Washing the mask

It is the employee's responsibility to wash their masks properly and to keep track of the maximum of 50 washes.

Use detergent when washing.

If stains are visible, the use of bleach is also possible.

1.4.1 Washing steps

- 1) Put the worn mask in the machine, with a conventional detergent, without fabric softener.
It is possible to wash other things at the same time (sheets or towels)
- 2) Wash at 60 C for at least 30 minutes
- 3) Dry the mask within 2 hours (in a tumble dryer, in the open air or with a hair dryer)
- 4) Iron the mask if needed but do not exceed 200 C.
- 5) Inspect the mask, especially at the seams, dispose of it if damaged.

What not to do

Do not boil the mask to clean it, as this may damage the fabric.

Do not freeze, it's not enough to destroy the viral agent.

Do not use ironing for washing

1.5 Visual

When the mask is mandatory in a define area, use this pictogram at the entry of the define area. The sign must be visible at all the time.
