### Testing artificial intelligence to reduce emissions

In 2022, a pilot program was completed in our simulators, to test EcoRail, an Al-enabled software that provides driving recommendations to locomotive engineers to reduce fuel consumption and resulting greenhouse gas emissions, without affecting travel time. The preliminary results showed significant benefits, with fuel-saving potential of up to 15%.

Building on that success, VIA Rail announced the extension of the pilot project, which started in 2023, to test the application in real train operations.

#### The path to a zero-waste experience

In 2022, we progressed towards our objective to offer by 2025 a zero-waste experience on our new Corridor fleet.

We initiated changes to products and packaging served on board to reduce waste at the source. For example, we removed extra packaging for sandwiches which alone is planned to reduce waste by more than six tonnes annually. We also completed initial testing of waste collection with onboard employees using a dedicated collection trolley to increase recycling.

#### **Building engagement towards sustainability**

In 2022, we partnered with Earth Day Canada, a recognized environmental organization, to host a conference on concrete, affordable solutions to help employees reduce their environmental impact on a daily basis.

Entitled *Adopting an Eco-Friendly Lifestyle*, the conference focused on concrete ways of fighting food waste, reducing personal waste, extending the useful life of belongings, and putting other cost-effective, eco-friendly tricks into use.

#### Aligning our community investments with the sustainability plan

As part of our sustainability plan, we aim to further align community investments with priorities of the plan to extend our reach.

Last year, VIA Rail supported the Tulip Festival through activities aimed at raising environmental awareness on the importance of pollinators for our ecosystems. We offered an educational workshop on this subject with our partner Alvéole. Thanks to our partnership with Alvéole, our stations in Vancouver, Winnipeg, Ottawa, and Québec City host more than 400,000 honeybees, which collectively pollinate approximately 113 km². With Alvéole, we completed eight educational workshops in 2022 aimed to encourage environmental action by reconnecting people to nature.
